

Quick facts: Komatsu in the United States

Komatsu is a global equipment manufacturing, service, solutions and technology company serving the construction, mining, forestry, forklift and industrial machinery industries. Globally, Komatsu employs more than 65,000 people across 150 countries.

History

- Through our legacy companies, Komatsu has been a proud member of the U.S. manufacturing community for more than a century, with a rich history dating back to 1884 (P&H surface mining equipment) and 1919 (Joy underground mining equipment).
- Komatsu itself established its first U.S. office in Chicago in 1963, and the company's first U.S. factory was our Chattanooga Manufacturing Operation (CMO), which started production in 1985.

Operations

- Komatsu employs more than 17,300 people across the U.S., including office, manufacturing and distributor employees.
- We have more than 100 locations across the U.S., including major manufacturing plants in Chattanooga, Tennessee; Duffield, Virginia; Homer City, Pennsylvania; Lebanon, Kentucky; Longview, Texas; Milwaukee, Wisconsin; Newberry, South Carolina; Peoria, Illinois; Shawano, Wisconsin; Reno, Pennsylvania; and Wellington, Utah.
- Komatsu equipment and solutions are sold in the U.S. through 25 independently owned and two company-owned dealerships, encompassing more than 200 branches across the country.
- Several key Komatsu business units are based in the U.S., including American Battery Solutions Inc. (Lake Orion, Michigan), Hensley Industries (Dallas, Texas), Komatsu America Corp. (Chicago), Komatsu Mining Corp. (Milwaukee), Mining Technology Solutions (Tucson, Arizona), and TimberPro Inc. (Shawano, Wisconsin).
- In FY2023, Komatsu spent \$3.5 billion on purchases from U.S. suppliers, including more than 6,400 companies across the country.
- More than 50% of Komatsu's U.S. machine revenue comes from machines produced in the U.S.
- Our U.S. operations export more products than we import, with a cumulative trade surplus of more than \$7.5 billion over the last decade. We are proud to be supporting multiple industries worldwide by leveraging the skills and capabilities of our U.S. manufacturing base.

Community impact

- Komatsu supports more than 160 nonprofit organizations in our local communities across the country, including food banks, workforce development, community development, disaster relief, environmental action and more. Some of the major organizations we support include Junior Achievement, Habitat for Humanity, United Way, FIRST Robotics, Green Forests Work, SkillsUSA and the Red Cross.
- We support workforce development with training programs focused on technical skills and manufacturing expertise and offer more than 100 internships each year. We also partner with the AED Foundation to help fund the development of programs to train the next generation of heavy equipment technicians.
- We honor and value our U.S. veterans and their families and are proudly engaged with helping them secure family-sustaining careers after their military service. We are an active member of DOD SkillBridge, Hiring Our Heroes and the Army Reserve's Private Public Partnership.
